Leader: Today we hang upon the cross the crown of thorns. With a crown of thorns we rejected, and mocked, the One Who chose us, and formed us for Himself that we might declare His praise.

People: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on us. With painful thorns we mocked Your Lordship. We refused You the honor due from Your creation; instead of praise we gave You suffering. In the shadow of Your cross we cry, "Have mercy on us."

Leader: The Lord Who made a way in the sea also makes a Way in the wilderness of our own chaos and disorientation. God's new thing is fully displayed in the life and death of Jesus! He offers the provision and guidance of His very self; we fail to perceive and accept it.

People: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on us. You Yourself are the Way made for us, but we have lost our way. In the shadow of Your cross we cry, "Have mercy on us."

Leader: Let us pray together . . .

ALL:

O God, whose glory it is always to have mercy: We look at Jesus, and we look at ourselves, and we confess the great difference.

Forgive us our fearful lack of trust. Deliver us from our willful fear;

conform us to His trust and obedience.

We thank You that through

the resurrection

Your grace abundantly pardons and transforms us! Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



The gospel reminds us to think about our own behaviors and not talk about the faults or sins of people in our community.





A Seder Meal is a reenactment of the Passover Meal that was first shared by God's people in ancient Egypt just before they left for the Promised Land. The meal is to remember how the Lord passed over them, spared them from death, and how He would bring them freedom from years of slavery, they were to celebrate this meal every year.

It is the same meal that Jesus shared with His disciples the night before He was put to death on the cross. As they shared it, it became the Lord's Supper, as Jesus gives of Himself to the disciples of that day, and for us to this day.

The Seder is a feast that includes reading, drinking wine, telling stories of the history of God's people, eating special foods, and singing. This meal is rich in meaning and purpose for us today.

It commemorates God's mighty act of deliverance of His people. It helps followers of Jesus to appreciate their Jewish roots. It points us toward God's Passover Lamb, Jesus. It helps us understand the origin of communion, the Lord's Supper. The emphasis with this meal is not on political freedom, but on freedom from the curse and punishment of sin provided in the death of Jesus. This meal is designed to be beautiful. Passover is a time of joy, praise, and fellowship.
