HISTORY HIGHLIGHTS OF FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

August 31, 1833	Purchase by Methodist Episcopal Church of 5 acres for \$25 at Smith's Crossroads for what became known as Richland Campground.
May 1, 1844	Change in name to Methodist Episcopal Church, South, when the General Conference adopted a Plan of Separation in the interest of peace, long jeopardized by the slavery question.
June 29, 1850	Joint purchase with Eastern Star Division No. 270 Sons of Temperance or 4 acres for \$5 at the site of the present day Vine Grove Methodist Church, for the building of a two-story house, the lower rooms for use by the church and the upper rooms by the Lodge.
About 1865	Removal to the old Academy building (described by old-timers as being between the South Dayton depot and the old Company Store), where Bishop Kavanaugh held a District Conference, followed by a revival meeting with many conversions.
August 17, 1871	Purchase from J.J. Abel, for \$100 of 1 acre of land, on the present church site, where a small building was erected.
1877	Change in name of town to Dayton with the coming of the railroad down the valley.
1886	Change in status from a preaching point on the Washington Circuit to a station
1888	Erection of two church buildings, the second in less than a year after the first had burned, to serve the 240 members.
July 12, 1925	Speaking by William Jennings Bryan (in Dayton to assist the prosecution in the world-famous Scopes Evolution Trial) to an overflow crowd at the morning service.
July 26, 1925	Death of Bryan during an afternoon nap in the house given for his use by F.R. Rogers, leader of the church, where Bryan had attended and led in prayer that morning.
1939	Change in name to First Methodist Church with the uniting of the Northern and Southern branches of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
1948	Renovation and brick veneering of the church and an addition of brick for the fellowship hall, kitchen and classrooms.
1957	Completion in size of present building with the two-story addition at the back for more classrooms and a parlor.
April 23, 1968	Change in name to First United Methodist Church with merger of the Evangelical United Brethren Church.
1980	Growth of lot, to present size with a parking lot addition


