

Advent Reading Week One - HOPE

Reader 1: The Advent wreath includes many symbols. The wreath is in the circle, with no beginning and no ending. This reminds us that there is no beginning and no ending to God, and that God's love and caring for us never ends. The green branches are a sign of ever new life. The candles tell us of the light shining into the world with Jesus Christ.

Reader 2: Purple has historically been associated with royalty and kingship. The purple candles symbolize the supremacy and kingship of Christ, who is recognized as the "King of Kings." The purple candles also signify repentance as we prepare to commemorate the birth of Jesus.

Reader 1: The Pink candle represents joy or triumph and this candle marks a transition in the season of Advent away from repentance and to a celebration. We light it to represent joy and the nearness of the birth of Jesus Christ. The white candle, which we light on Christmas Eve, signifies the birth of Jesus.

Reader 2: Today we light the first purple candle, the candle of hope. (Light the first candle.)

Reader 1: The prophet Jeremiah spoke words of hope in Jeremiah 29:11 - "For I know the plans *and* thoughts that I have for you,' says the LORD, 'plans for peace *and* well-being and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope." We hope and pray for a world of peace and harmony.

Reader 2: Hope is like a flame that warms and comforts us. As we light this candle, we celebrate the hope of the prophets and the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

All: We continue to hope in God's promise that Christ will continue to fill our lives and the life of the world with love and joy and peace.

All Pray: Thank you, God for the flame of hope. As we prepare for Christ's coming, help us to share our hope with others.

We will be beginning the Christmas Card Exchange

Get your Christmas greeting cards filled out & ready for your fellow parishioners.

We will have 2 wrapped boxes: one in the front of the sanctuary and one at the back for you to deposit your Christmas cards **STARTING AT ADVENT.**

Volunteers separate the cards and place them in labeled bags for each family.

Family bags can be picked up beginning Dec 17th.

This is a fundraiser for the youth, so that they can raise money for Resurrection in January—so any donations would be appreciated—you can include them in your card packets when you drop them in the box—or place it in the donation plate on Sunday.
